1. ____ A meeting of the members of a party in a legislative chamber to select party leaders and to develop party policy. Called a conference by the Republicans.
2. ____ Party leader who is the liaison between the leadership and the rank-and-file in the legislature.
3. ____ Mutual aid and vote trading among legislators.
4. ____ A formal decision to reject a bill passed by Congress after it adjourns – if Congress adjourns during the ten days that the president is allowed in order to sign or veto law, the president can reject the law by taking no action at all.
5. ____ An elected office that is predictably won by one party or the other, so the success of that party's candidate is almost taken for granted.
6. ____ A procedure for terminating debate, especially filibusters, in the Senate.
7. ____ A procedural practice in the Senate whereby a senator refused to relinquish the floor and thereby delays proceedings and prevents a vote on a controversial issue.
8. ____ The principle of a two-house legislature.
9. ____ The assigning by Congress of congressional seats after each census. State legislatures reapportion state legislative districts.
10. ____ The drawing of legislative district boundaries to benefit a party, group, or incumbent.
11. ____ Presidential custom of submitting the names of prospective appointees for approval to senators from the states in which the appointees are to work.
12. ____ An official who is expected to represent the views of his or her constituents even when personally holding different views; one interpretation of the role of the legislator.
13. ____ A provision attached to a bill – to which it may or may not be related – in order to secure its passage.
14. ____ The powers explicitly given to Congress in the Constitution.
15. ____ Formal accusation against a president or other public official, the first step in removal from office.
16. ____ The president's annual statement to Congress and the nation.
17. ____ A formal decision to reject the bill passed by Congress.
18. ____ Presidential staff the agency that serves as a clearinghouse for budgetary requests and management improvements for government agencies.
19. ____ An official who is expected to vote independently based on his or her judgment of the circumstances; one interpretation of the role of the legislator.
20. ____ The current holders of elected office.
21. ____ The head of the White House staff.
22. ____ Presidential power to strike, or remove, specific items from a spending bill without vetoing the entire package; declared unconstitutional by the Supreme Court.
23. ____ Formal orders issued by the president to direct action by the federal bureaucracy.
24. ____ Powers that grow out of the very existence of government.
25. ____ A formal, public agreement between the United States and one or more nations that must be approved by two thirds of the Senate.
26. ____ The right to keep executive communications confidential, especially if they relate to National Security.
27. ____ Advisory council for the president consisting of the heads of the executive departments, the vice president, and a few other officials selected by the president.
28. ____ A decision by the president not to spend money appropriated by Congress, now prohibited under federal law.
29. ____ A president's claim of broad public support.
30. ____ A formal agreement between the U.S. president and the leaders of other nations that does not require senate approval.
